#### What is Parents as Teachers?

It's a home visiting program that helps young children become better learners well <u>before</u> they get to school. It helps parents and family members link to other community resources, learn from other families, and become more involved in their child's development.

#### What do you get from Parents as Teachers?

- Regularly scheduled home visits from a trained Parent Educator who brings parenting and child development/behavior tips based on your child's age.
- Age- appropriate activities you can do with your child to encourage learning.
- Free health and developmental screening (such as hearing, sight and growth)
- Pregnant women can start before birth and continue after child is born.

# **Qualifier Definitions**

Low Income	Households with an income at or below 100% of the poverty guidelines according to: <a href="https://aspe.hhs.gov/poverty-guidelines">https://aspe.hhs.gov/poverty-guidelines</a>
Pregnant and under 21	Household with expectant mothers who enroll in the program and are under 21 years old during the reporting period (June-July).
History of abuse or neglect	Households with members who have history of abuse or neglect and have had involvement with child welfare services <b>based on self-report.</b> This can include child, caregivers, or both.
History of substance abuse	Household members who have a history of substance abuse <b>based on self-report</b> or a screening instrument.
Any Tobacco use	Households with members who use tobacco products in the home <b>based on self-report</b> , including combustibles (cigarettes, cigars, pipes, hookahs, bidis) non-combustibles (chew, dip, snuff, snus, and dissolvable), and electronic nicotine delivery systems (such as E-Cigarettes, vapes, Juuls)
Low student achievement	Household members who <b>Self-report</b> that they perceive themselves or their child(ren) as having low student achievement.
Development Delays	Household members who have child(ren) with potential developmental delay or disability based on self-report or parent educator observation.
Military	Households with individuals who are currently serving or formerly served in the Armed Forces based on self-report, and their children.
